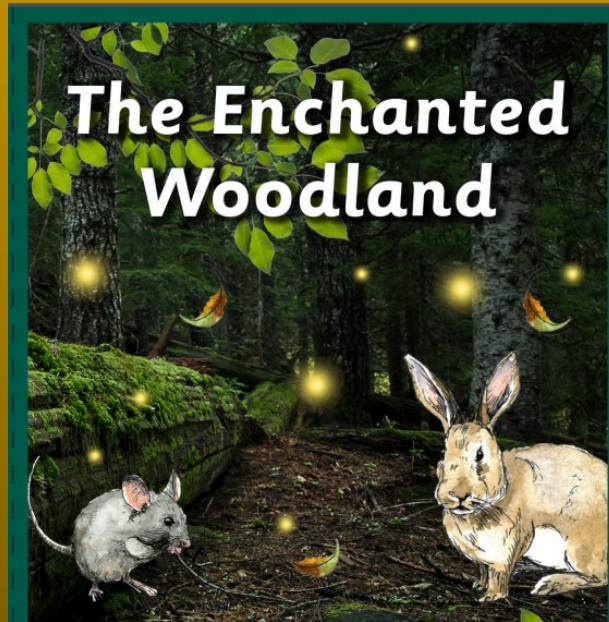


Summer Term 2

This half term, we'll visit a woodland, observe the wildlife, collect natural objects and take beautiful pictures of the things we see. After our woodland adventure, we'll write about our experiences and learn all about trees. We'll use information books to investigate woodland creatures and make mini-books of our own. Throughout the project, we will find out how to recognise different plants and animals and create detailed, observational drawings of them. The tale of Hansel and Gretel will inspire us to write our own stories with a woodland theme. We'll build miniature dens, create woodland works of art and construct mini-woodlands from twigs, sticks, pine cones and leaves.

English

This Term we will be reading the story 'The Lonely Beast'. We will be covering many Writing opportunities. We will compose re-counts of the story and scene. We will respond from the illustration and information We will compose letters and write lists. We will also role play in news reporting for the lonely beast. Carrying out interviews and rehearsing our questions for welcoming the lonely beast.



Mathematics

This term we will be covering Spotting 2-digits on empty number grids, finding 2-digit numbers in order, identifying even and odd numbers. We will go over how to create 2-digit numbers. Complete patterns using our odd and even number skills. We will be going over our multiplications and doubling number with money. We will also go over recognising how to tell the time.

Science

Identifying and classifying plants, This term we will be identifying, garden, wild and fruit plants. We will identify the characteristics and appearance of how a plant should look. We will also plant a seed from the beginning of the term and take care of the plant till the very end. We will observe our plant throughout the term to see how it has developed in 6 weeks.

- Plant some daisies, poppies or any other garden plants at home. Draw and write a flower diary about the changes you see every week. Draw pictures and take photograph as it changes throughout the weeks.
- Go for a walk in the forest or park. Take pictures of what plants may come across your journey.

- Write a clues about woodland animals. Play with your family and friends.
- Write a letter to Mr Fox and tell him what you been learning about the woodlands .
